BACKGROUND:

- A great many gatherings, seminars, forums, and round tables have been held on the subject of rambling and outdoor pursuits.
- Rambling has established itself in our society as a sport – a form of physical activity conducive to the social welfare of the European population and the enjoyment of nature. In this sense, rambling affects the economy, tourism and the environment; it is also a tool for bringing about certain results in health, social relations, personal development and mobility. In all these senses rambling is a right or a service to be provided to the European public.
- The sustainable and orderly use of nature in practising sporting activities, particularly rambling, which is a growth sport.

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DESCRIPTION OF THE SEMINAR

Rambling and mountain sports in Europe are practised on an ever larger scale, with a growing effect on nature. Any person in Europe is now certain of being able to contact and be within nature. Growing awareness of the environment's importance has induced public administrative bodies to structure and regulate its use, largely by introducing environmental conservation and protection legislation, especially thorough the Natural Resource Structural Plans and Master Plans for the Use and Management of Protected Natural Areas, throughout Spain and in Andalucía in particular. This has made it necessary to study, analyze and put forward proposals about *the right to use accesses to nature on the part of the European public, which should not lose its rights to the free use, and free and structured enjoyment, of nature* – speaking in concrete terms of public open spaces, lanes and paths. This reality is common to the whole of Europe.

This 4TH SEMINAR ON RAMBLERS' ACCESS TO NATURE will be geared towards studying and participation, with a social and institutional outreach which the **European Ramblers Association** (henceforth ERA), aims to perform with the co-operation of all the institutions, and with the sponsorship of the Council of Europe (Directorate of Youth and Sport), the Spanish Government (Higher Sports Council), the Regional Government of Andalucía and the Diputación of Malaga.

It's a forum for meeting and exchanging views on the situation of access to nature on foot throughout the European continent. It seeks to arrive at an appraisal of the situation, putting forward proposals for improvement by writing a statement. Furthermore, it's planned to cover more specific issues, making the most of having specialists on the spot.

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The thematic content of this seminar will be:

- The concept of the public use of land, and how it compares with the right of way.
- Rambling as a lifestyle activity, a sports activity and a tourist activity.
- The contribution of sports-type physical activity to the health, social relations, and education of human beings.
- The development and protection of the environment through the practising of sport.
- The creation of a new pool of jobs in an emerging sector with a demand for services.
- The need to further the existing studies about rambling: sports law, education, the mass phenomenon, the tourist attraction phenomenon, etc.

The aim of this international seminar is the drawing up of a set of documents describing the territorial situation for the practice of rambling in each area of Europe. The resulting documents will be available to the responsible person in each such area.

It is of interest to the ERA that these speeches should cover a series of subjects which may lead to the formulation of joint proposals that will enable us to generate a working strategy together. There's no reason why the writer of each speech should not decide in how much depth to deal with these matters, and how to present them; and he or she will be able to add as many subjects as he or she deems appropriate to his or her speech.

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AIMS

Given the magnitude of this content and the needs of the Europe-wide associations conscious of the need to produce ideas and documents to serve as a benchmark in these thematic areas, the following broad aims have been set:

- To set standards and make recommendations about the use of nature so that countries will take into account that it needs to be used sustainably.
- To forge links with sports tourism as an activity in demand, and to make new regulations concerning the use and abuse of nature as a sports facility.
- To make private bodies and public institutions aware that the public have a right to use nature.
- To cultivate respect for private property which is crossed by rights of way along lanes, paths and the bottoms of gorges throughout Europe.

CONTENT

- The characteristics of the rambler's passage along all passable routes (whether this passage be free, with permission, restricted, prohibited, etc.)
- The creation of a general regulatory framework for passable routes: constitutions, general laws, specific regulations ...
- The classifying and grading of walkable lanes, roads, coastal areas, margins of watercourses, etc.
- The current existence of traditional rights of way on foot.
- The permits necessary for performing a rambling activity.
- The permits necessary for waymarking a footpath officially recognized by the local authority.
- The existence and updating of a public register of footpaths, bridleways and green lanes.

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- Protection of historic ways: definition, listing and legislation.

PAPERS BY GEOGRAPHICAL AREA

The papers by geographical area follow the scheme whereby each European geographical area is represented by an expert. Set out below are their foci of

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study, which will make it possible to compare the state of affairs in different countries, according to the **following systematic arrangement:**

- Class/type of area passable by persons (lanes, roads, coastal areas, margins of watercourses, etc.)
- The characteristics of the rambler's passage along all passable routes (whether this passage be free, free with permission, restricted, prohibited, etc.)
- The general regulatory framework of passable routes: constitutions, general laws, specific regulations
- A study of whether traditional rights of way are still current
- The permits necessary for performing a rambling activity
- The permits necessary for waymarking a footpath
- The existence of a public register of footpaths or similar
- Historic ways: the existence of protective legislation, etc.

AREAS OF KNOWLEDGE

- AREA 1: THE RIGHT TO PRACTISE SPORT: LAND OPEN FOR USE, AND PRIVATE PROPERTY.
 - Does a waymarked footpath tried out and approved by the ramblers' federation count as a sports facility, within nature?
 - Could the Spanish GR 92 long-distance Mediterranean footpath – a section of pan-European trail E 10 – be a strategy for recovering the coastline for the public?

NOTE: papers submitted on the E 10 in the rest of Europe (outside Spain) may deal with the situation of this footpath in each country

- AREA 2: TOURISM AND ENVIRONMENT: INFRASTRUCTURE DESIGN. NATURAL WORLD AND SUSTAINABILITY.

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- Under what circumstances does the existence of a network of tried out and approved, high-quality, and adequately waymarked footpaths influence the sustainable development of the local authority areas where it exists?
- When tried out and approved footpaths within Protected Natural Areas are put on the map or otherwise promoted, how does this contribute to public environmental awareness?

➤ **AREA 3: TERRITORIAL MANAGEMENT FOR SPORT: THE PLANNING AND MANAGEMENT OF RAMBLING. ORGANIZATIONAL TECHNIQUES AND USE OF NATURE.**

- Does the practising of rambling by the majority of the population have effects on its physical and mental-emotional health?
- How would you describe a typical Rambler – what type of person is he/she? How frequently does he/she go rambling? Etc.

NOTE: In charge of each area will be a person connected with the Scientific Committee, whose job it will be to write a brief synthesis on the topic. For this purpose, observations about the situation in Europe – in English or Spanish – may be sent to the email address given for the 4th Seminar.

SUBMISSION OF TEXTS

Submissions should be written in a vein of research and conceptual analysis, according to the systematic arrangement under "Papers by Geographical Area" above and, in the case of the state of affairs, according to different countries. They may be submitted in summary form or in full. Submissions must be kept to a maximum of 4,000 words per paper (12 sheets printed on one side only including abstract and bibliography). Single line spacing should be used. Times New Roman font, size 12. Top, bottom and right margin to be 2.5 cm., and left margin 3 cm.

Structure for the paper: Title of the work. Author(s). Institution or work centre and country. Address, telephone number and email address of the main author. Preference as to presentation: orally delivered paper or Area of Knowledge poster. Audio-Visual Equipment required. The text, structured as follows: Introduction, Aims, Material and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusions and Bibliography.

Please ensure that your presentation meets the grammar rules of the language in which it is written, and is free of mistyped words. Papers may be presented in **Spanish** or **English** and should be emailed to the Secretariat of the Scientific Committee (**amerino@malaga.es**); alternatively you may post a paper original and one copy together with an electronic copy on **CD ROM**.

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The time allocated for presenting papers will be 10 minutes, including debate. Authors will be asked to be present to answer any questions. Papers will not be translated.

Submissions should reach the organizers by **20th April 2008**.

Papers sent in on time and accepted by the Scientific Committee will be published in the **Proceedings of the Seminar**, which will be handed over to each participant at the closing ceremony in digital format, for which purpose it will be necessary for the author or, as appropriate, the authors as a whole, to have paid the registration fees.

Presenting **posters** represents an excellent opportunity to communicate with a select and specifically interested audience. Authors will have to answer questions from Seminar participants interested in the content of the poster, which will measure 90 x 120 cm.

To present a poster please email the Secretary General of the Seminar a summary of it as an attached Word document no longer than one side of A4 DIN paper, specifying the Area of Knowledge to which it belongs and the personal details of the author(s).

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The Seminar website will display complementary details about the organizational structure, additions and changes to the programme, a list of accepted papers, types of certificate to be issued, characteristics of the Proceedings of the Seminar, complementary activities, a list of hotels and restaurants, and other information of interest.

Registered participants will be sent a list of papers and workshops both for their information and to be noted on their certificate of accreditation.

To confirm actual registrations for the Seminar, the organizers will publish a list of registered persons on 1ST JUNE 2008 on the Seminar website.
